

What is a chaplain?



One third of women meet the criteria for clinical depression after entering widowhood. In the first year, 50% of widows leave their church. Widows often express that they feel overlooked, even forgotten.

Just as the Apostles prioritized the care of widows in the early church, we need to continue this ministry. I am called to bring to the forefront this biblical mandate. To ensure successful ministry, we equip churches with resources to become a support system. By giving churches a strong foundation, they are able to minister to widows in their community, sharing hope and encouragement to those that desperately need it!






Ken and Jenna Combs






Lee and Gretchen Watson




